Leadership Goals, Objectives and Evaluation Form

The purpose of this form is to identify a scout's personal goals and objectives that will be evaluated to determine completion of a leadership requirement for the ranks of Star, Life and Eagle and Eagle Palms. The Scout and Scoutmaster (or his designee) should complete this form during the Scout's Scoutmaster Conference.

A Scout will be considered to have completed the requirement for leadership when the Scout and the Scoutmaster agree that the Scout has met these minimum requirements or substantial equals.

The goals and objectives should be identified in the conference and be mutually agreeable, and of a sufficient level of skill, difficulty, and challenge, that they will help foster the Scout's growth in leadership, and demonstrate a rank appropriate level of leadership.

As a scout, I understand that to fulfill the aims and ideals of the Boy Scouts of America requires dedication, hard work, appropriate adult counseling and a commitment to Troop 357. To this end, as a measurement of my leadership, I will do my best to accomplish the following seven items as a minimum:

(The Scout must set three (3) goals of development in consultation with the Scoutmaster, and list them here.)

4. Maintain your personal leadership diary.

In addition a scout must CHOOSE THREE (3) OF THE FOLLOWING.....

5. Perform one scout skill demonstration for the troop. The subject will be studied, visual aids prepared (such as charts, handouts, samples, movies, slides, posters, etc). The skill will coincide with the monthly theme and be approved by the Patrol Leaders Council

6. Lead the Troop in one game that they have not played before. The game will be researched, any props gathered, the rules explained, and the game master will act as judge, jury, referee etc. as needed. Prizes for the winners are encouraged. PLC Approval Required

7. Identify one scout of lessor rank than your self (preferably in your patrol). Help that scout advance to the next rank. A minimum of five (5) requirements must be passed, including

two that must be done in the outdoors. If the scout that you partner with has less than five requirements remaining, then a rank and other requirements (total of 5) will be needed.

8. Act as Campfire MC on a Troop Campout. Lead a troop campfire. Lead other Scouts in building a fire. The ceremony must have an opening, closing, and a skit or song by each patrol. Assist the patrol in skit and song choice and preparation. SPL Approval Req.
9. Participate six hours in another scouts Eagle Service Project, OR, lead the troop or your patrol in community service (approved in advance by the scoutmaster) for a minimum of three (3) hours. You must lead yourself and a minimum of 3 other scouts. Adult Supervision required per BSA rules.
10. Actively participate in the Order of the Arrow by attending three (3) monthly chapter meetings and one Chapter or Lodge activity such as a service project, Ordeal, Conclave, etc. Scoutmaster Approval Required.
11. Perform a function, as agreed upon by the scoutmaster, with the High Adventure group, which is similar in nature to a troop position such as Hikemaster, Quartermaster, Scribe, Crew Leader, Grubmaster, etc. These goals and objectives should be outlined separately.

You must be active in the troop and its activities as outlined in troop policy. These include, but are not limited to : Attendance at 75% of Troop meetings required by your term of leadership, and 75% of Troop Outdoor Activities. For instance, Star requires a four month commitment. $4 \text{ months} \times 4 \text{ Troop meetings per month} \times .75 = 12$, $4 \text{ mnths} \times 4 \text{ Campouts} \times .75 = 3$. A high adventure trip or OA function may substitute for ONE (1) campout or meeting.

I understand and accept the commitment necessary to demonstrate leadership in Troop 357. I agree to work towards the above outlined goals to the best of my ability. I understand that I may demonstrate leadership in other manners that are equal to the goals I have chosen. If I do, I will bring it to the attention of the scoutmaster or my coach counselor.
